

We are grateful to God for allowing the World Mission Report to support the European Summer Bible Conference. From April 17th to 19th, the team traveled to Gwangju, Busan, and Seoul to share the message and their missionary work.

Pastor Ron Ward, UBF General Director, emphasized the importance of looking at the world through God's eyes based on John 4:35. From K-pop to K food and even K tank, the world is paying attention to Korea. Like the Macedonians, the world is waiting for the gospel preached by Korean shepherds. He encouraged the attendees to open our eyes and see this vision through the European Conference.

Shep. Reiner shared why the title "The Way" was chosen for the European Conference. He explained that Europe was once blessed by the spread of early Christianity. However, the corruption and formalism of Catholicism and various humanistic philosophical trends have made the Christian faith nominal. He called for European intellectuals to realize again that Jesus is the only way to salvation and to return to Jesus through the Bible, just as missionary Caleb Hong studied the Bible with him on a train decades ago.

Missionary Paulo Kim arrived in Brazil, the land of opportunity, 26 years ago. However, the gospel ministry and financial self-supporting were very difficult. Although they faced limitations, God raised their three daughters to be mothers of faith and co-workers, and now the eldest and second daughters are starting a family and serving together.

Shep. Elizabeth expressed her gratitude to the Korean missionaries who helped her become what she is today, especially missionary Monica Park, who went to heaven ahead. She reported on the solid partnership of the four chapters in Lagos and the continued formation of disciples.

In particular, Missionaries Debora Yang and Daniel Yang gave inspiring reports. M Debora emphasized the importance of prayer and faith, while M Daniel reported on the Rwandan ministry established under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. He confessed that he is now living the happiest life as a shepherd since he began his life as a missionary in 1978. The local leaders have a strong spiritual desire and humbly receive the Word of God and serve God's flock as they receive the Word. Thus far, three families have been established, international student missionaries have been sent out, and more than 50 one-on-one Bible studies are conducted every week.

Over 200 people from Gwangju and more than 500 from Seoul attended the event and were encouraged and inspired. During the event, more than 100 people in Seoul stood up and pledged to become missionaries. We are grateful to God for making this World Mission Report a blessing, renewing our hearts, and providing prayerful support for the European Conference.
