Dress Code Regulations

For the purpose of maintaining a decorous, respectful, and appropriate environment for a Bible Conference, we ask all participants to dress in a modest and prudent manner during all activities.

It is not necessary to dress in a completely formal way, but clothing is expected to be clean, appropriate, and respectful for the Christian context of the Conference.

1. General Dress Code

During meetings, workshops, times of praise, meals, and general activities, it is recommended to wear casual or semi-casual clothing.

Jeans, pants, skirts, dresses, T-shirts, blouses, shirts, sweatshirts, and comfortable clothing are permitted. However, we ask participants to avoid clothing that is too revealing, transparent, too tight, or too short.

We also ask participants to avoid plunging necklines, pants worn too low, or any garment that could distract or cause discomfort to other participants.

T-shirts or tops may have images, designs, or phrases, as long as they are appropriate for our gathering. We ask participants to avoid clothing with messages, images, or symbols that are offensive, violent, connected to political ideologies, or associated with musical groups that are inappropriate for the context of the Conference.

2. Dress Code for the Pool and the Beach

As part of the Conference, we will have access to a pool and will also have some hours of fellowship at the beach. Participants may wear swimwear, but we ask that it be worn in a modest, respectable, and appropriate manner for a Christian environment.

For men, swim shorts or Bermuda-style swimwear should be worn, together with a swim shirt, water shirt, or rash guard, even while in the water. The use of thongs, overly tight swimwear, or garments that inappropriately expose the body is not permitted.

For women, a one-piece swimsuit, tankini, or swimwear accompanied by shorts, a swim skirt, water shirt, rash guard, or a similar garment that helps maintain modesty is recommended. We ask participants to avoid small bikinis, thongs, overly revealing swimwear, or transparent garments.

When walking outside the pool or beach area, such as in hallways, common areas, the dining room, classrooms, transportation, or any other fellowship space, everyone must cover themselves appropriately with a T-shirt, cover-up, dress, shorts, sweatpants, or a similar garment.

3. General Principle

The intention of these regulations is not to impose legalism, but to promote an environment of respect, mutual care, and good Christian testimony. We want everyone to be able to enjoy the Conference and the recreational activities with freedom, but also with consideration toward others.

We ask all participants to come prepared with appropriate clothing for the meetings, recreational activities, time at the pool, and visit to the beach.
